Education, Certifications & Licensure



A highly qualified staff is the heart of our organization. Assisted Independence employs and works with a variety of individuals with varying educational backgrounds. These backgrounds include but are not limited to Physical Therapy, Occupational Therapy, Recreational Therapy, Behavior Analyst, Behavior Technician, Teachers, Teacher Assistants, Social Workers, Nursing, Music Therapy, Nutritionist and American Red Cross Instructors.

Listed below are the basic requirements to obtain the degrees necessary to serve the individuals we serve.

PHYSICAL THERAPY

Physical therapy degrees are only available at the doctoral level. Most programs last three years and include several clinical internships with supervised experience.

Before enrolling in a doctoral degree program for physical therapy, you must meet certain prerequisites. This normally includes completing a bachelor's degree in Anatomy, Physiology, Biology, Chemistry or Physics. All states require PTs to become licensed. Licensing requirements are set by individual states but include passing the National Physical Therapy Examination (NPTE), which is administered by the Federation of State Boards of Physical Therapy (FSBPT). After working in the field, physical therapists may apply to become a board-certified specialist in one of eight clinical specialty areas offered by the American Board of Physical Therapy Specialties. In order to become board-certified, physical therapists must complete at least 2,000 hours of clinical work or an APTA-accredited residency program in the specialty area and pass an exam.

RECREATIONAL THERAPY

Recreational therapists need a bachelor's degree. Recreational therapy programs include courses in assessment, human anatomy, medical and psychiatric terminology, characteristics of illnesses and disabilities, and the use of assistive devices and technology. Bachelor's degree programs include an internship. A qualified recreational therapist is nationally certified as a Certified Therapeutic Recreation Specialist (CTRS), usually referred to as Recreational Therapists.

Qualified professionals are certified through the National Council for Therapeutic Recreation Certification (NCTRC), which requires a bachelor's degree or higher from an accredited university, a formal internship and the passing of a national certification examination. A CTRS must maintain their credential every five years through the NCTRC recertification process.

OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY

According to the American Occupational Therapy Association, a variety of undergraduate majors can prepare occupational therapists for the graduate-level study they need to work in the field. These include kinesiology, psychology, anthropology, biology, and sociology. Some schools offer accelerated or dual degree programs, through which students can obtain a bachelor's and master's degree in occupational therapy after about five years of study. Master's degree programs in occupational therapy typically take two years to complete. Students also participate in approximately 24 weeks of field experiences. Occupational therapists must obtain a state license. Requirements include completion of an accredited occupational therapy program, fieldwork experiences, and a passing score on the National Board for Certification in Occupational Therapy (NBCOT) exam. Successful candidates for licensure receive the Occupational Therapist Registered (OTR) credential through the NBCOT.

BEHAVIOR ANALYST

Behavior analysts must hold a master's degree in applied behavior analysis, education, or psychology to be certified. In addition to a master's degree, an approved university-supervised practicum or hours of supervised work experience is required. The supervised practicum varies in required hours based on the intensity of supervision, but the required hours is 750 for intense supervision, and 1,000 hours for a typical practicum. To become a Board Certified Behavior Analyst, licensing departments establish requirements for behavior analysis licenses on a state-by-state basis. This includes a graduate degree from an accredited university, completion of the required amount of supervised practical hours, and passing the licensure exam. Most states require licenses to be renewed every two years.



BEHAVIOR TECHNICIAN

The Registered Behavior Technician RBT is a paraprofessional who practices under the close, ongoing supervision of a BCBA. Though you do not need a college degree to be an RBT,

most insurance companies prefer a college degree. You must also complete 40 hours of training, complete a background check, pass the RBT Competency Assessment, and pass the RBT examination.

RBTs have ongoing certification requirements which include receiving ongoing supervision and complying with the BACB's RBT Ethics Code. RBTs must annually renew their certification, including passing the RBT Competency Assessment, and completing a renewal application.

TEACHER ASSISTANT

Teacher's aides are required to meet one of two criteria. The first is to complete either two years of university coursework, which is 48 credit hours, or to earn an Associate of Science or an Associate of Art degree at an accredited college. There is no specification, however, for the focus of this education. Students interested in working as a teacher's aide can take classes that focus on topics like the emotional and social development of children, the psychology of education, ethical issues for teachers, and educational philosophy.

The second option for becoming a teacher's aide is to pass the Praxis ParaPro Assessment. Indiana requires at least a 460 score on this computer-

TEACHER

To be eligible for Indiana teacher licensing, applicants must hold a bachelor's degree, complete an approved teacher preparation program, and pass the state-required tests. Candidates must also earn CPR/AED/Heimlich certification and complete suicide prevention training, programs which are typically included in teacher preparation curricula in the state. Indiana uses a tiered system with two levels of teaching licensure: Initial Practitioner and Proficient Practitioner. The Initial Practitioner is a renewable two-year license for first-time teachers. While teaching under the Initial Practitioner license, teachers must complete the Indiana Mentoring and Assessment Program (IMAP), a two-year mentored internship. The Proficient Practitioner license is a renewable five-year license issued to working teachers who have successfully completed the IMAP.

based exam. Examinees are given two and half hours to answer 90 multiple-choice questions, which focus on reading, math, and writing. The reading portion tests a future aide's ability to identify a writing passage's main purpose and supporting ideas, as well as their ability to teach students how to sound words out and use contextual clues to learn the meaning of words. The math section tests examinees' ability to complete basic mathematical functions and interpret graphical representations of data. Finally, the writing subtest covers basic grammar and word choice and tests examinees' ability to help students formulate ideas and choose source material.

SOCIAL WORK

The foundation of a career in social work begins at the undergraduate level, as students work toward their bachelor's degree in social work. After several semesters of meeting graduation requirements, social work students will split off into their major and concentration area, focusing on areas relevant to the occupation. Most undergraduate social work programs required a minimum of two semester long supervised practicums.

The health services industry requires social workers to have obtained at least a graduate education, holding an MSW in order to qualify for these more advanced positions. MSW programs build on the undergraduate foundation, but they focus more exclusively on social services policy and regulation, occupational ethics, social work leadership theory, and practical execution of these skills. The average MSW program requires at least 900 hours of supervised instruction on the job in a social work capacity, which will be assessed, critiqued, and graded, based on the candidate's use of their skills gleaned from graduate-level coursework. The doctoral level of study is focused primarily on research. Those pursuing their doctorate will focus on a very narrow field of study and research, spending their time with the university in order to test and prove a hypothesis. This research is designed to further the field of social work itself, and the doctoral program at large is dedicated to producing candidates who can go on to teach collegiate courses, take on executive positions within social work organizations, or perform further research and policy analysis as a full-time occupation.



If you wish to attain the title Licensed Social Worker (LSW) in Indiana, you will need to complete the following steps: You must first get a Bachelor of Social Work or a Master of Social Work degree from a Council on Social Work Education (CSWE) accredited university or college. You will need to document two years of work supervised by a Licensed Social Worker or a Licensed Clinical Social Worker. If you have a Master's degree you do not need to provide proof of experience. If you wish to hold the title of Licensed Clinical Social Worker (LCSW) in Indiana, you will need to take the following steps: You will first need to obtain a Master's degree or Doctorate of Social Work degree from a Council on Social Work Education (CSWE) accredited university or college. MSW applicants must submit proof of two (2) years of experience in the practice of clinical social work in counseling of clients in a clinical setting.

Both years must have been obtained after receiving your MSW degree.

NURSING

CNA: To become a CNA, you must complete a state-approved education program. These programs can often be found in nursing homes, technical colleges and even through the American Red Cross. A CNA program can take three to eight weeks, depending on whether it is full- or part-time. Upon completion of the program, aspiring nursing assistants must pass an exam to earn their CNA (or related) title. After successful completion, CNAs are state-certified.

LPN: LPNs get their start by successfully completing a Practical Nursing Diploma program. These programs can be found at technical schools, community colleges or career colleges and

can usually be completed in as few as 12 months. After graduation, you'll be required to pass the National Council Licensure Examination (NCLEX-PN) to receive your license and be qualified to work.

Additional certification is also available for nurses at the LPN level. Certifications show that an LPN or LVN has an advanced level of knowledge about a specific subject, according to the BLS. To gain an edge in the job market or to acquire some specialty training, LPNs can earn certification in specialized areas like IV therapy, developmental disabilities, childbirth and more.

RN: There are two educational paths that can lead to a career as an RN: earning an Associate's Degree in Nursing (ADN) or earning a Bachelor's of Science in Nursing (BSN). A typical ADN program can be completed in as few as 18 months. On the other hand, earning your BSN could be done in about 33 months, or as few as 18 months with a prior degree under your belt.

When choosing which track to take, it's important to think ahead and determine what the educational preferences are for the type of work you want. Some employers (especially hospitals) require RNs to have a Bachelor's degree. Many working RNs with an ADN opt to

go back to school later to earn their Bachelor's degree through an RN-to-BSN online program, which can be done in as few as 12 to 18 months. But whichever educational avenue you take, you will still have to pass the National Council Licensure Examination (NCLEX) if you want to start working as an RN. Additional requirements may also exist depending on your state, so be sure to look into statewide RN qualifications as well. The first step toward becoming an advanced practice registered nurse is becoming an RN. MSN programs typically require candidates to first have an RN license, with most preferring a BSN degree as opposed to an ADN or Diploma, according to the BLS.

The next step is to gain acceptance into an accredited MSN program and earn your degree. Depending on the specialty you wish to pursue, there might be further requirements, including clinical experience or additional certification. After graduation, the BLS states that you'll likely need to pass a national certification exam in their area of expertise. Requirements vary slightly by



WHAT IS A MEDICAID WAIVER PROGRAM?

The Medicaid Waiver Program supports eligible individuals of any age who have special medical or developmental needs so that they may live in a least restrictive environment while receiving person-centered supports they need.

The Indiana Family and Social Services Administration (FSSA) through the Department of Disability and Rehabilitative Services (DDRS) oversees two waivers, the Family Supports Waiver (FSW) and the Community Integration and Habilitation Waiver (CIH).

NUTRITIONIST

Many entry-level nutritionists have a bachelor's degree in health, nutrition or a related field, such as dietetics or food service system management. Undergraduate programs that lend themselves to a career as a nutritionist may include the following: Food science, Microbiology, Dietetics, Chemistry, Nutrition, Biochemistry, Clinical Nutritional Care, Anatomy, Community nutrition, Psychology, Biology. Bachelor's degree programs can be completed in four years. During their

training, students may also have to complete an internship, either during their undergraduate program or shortly after graduation.

Licensure and certification requirements differ across the country. Many states require nutritionists to obtain and update special certifications, while others require completion of exams to prove knowledge and skills.

The Registered Dietitian Nutritionist (RDN) and Registered Dietitian (RD) credentials, which are administered by the Commission on Dietetic Registration, meet the requirements for licensing in some states. In order to earn one of these credentials, you need to: Graduate from an approved and accredited bachelor's degree program, complete a supervised practice program, pass a national examination and complete continuing education requirements

MUSIC THERAPY

Music Therapists must have at least a BA in their field. Those interested in graduate school can obtain an MA degree or a doctoral degree that combines music therapy with related areas of study. Aspiring Music Therapists who did not major in music for undergraduate can sometimes take equivalency courses before pursuing their MA, depending on the school.

Even the most basic education requirements to become a Music Therapist are rigorous. Aspiring Music Therapists take courses in music, biology, psychology, physiology, social and behavioral sciences. In the final two years of study, students are required to complete 1200 hours of fieldwork as an intern in a health or education-related

setting.

An MA degree or a doctoral degree combines music therapy with related areas of study. Aspiring Music Therapists who did not major in music for undergraduate can sometimes take equivalency courses before pursuing their MA, depending on the school.

All Music Therapists must pass a certification exam from the Certification Board for Music Therapists and continue to pass the exam every five years or take recertification credits.

Successfully passing the exam will give the Music Therapist the designation of Music Therapist-Board Certified (MT-BC).

A deep knowledge of several musical instruments is vital

AMERICAN RED CROSS INSTRUCTORS

Before you can become a CPR instructor you need to be certified in CPR. You can register for a class with your local Red Cross. When you complete the training and after you pass a certification exam, you will be certified for two years.

Certification is based on demonstration of skills and passing written test at end of class. Rules for the exam vary.

Prior to beginning the instructor course, one needs to complete an online instructional video with exam. Once completed, you will need to provide proof to the instructor of the online portion in order to be eligible for the instructor course.

The course is approximately 16 hours which includes three presentations, hands on skills, lectures, assignments, videos and a written exam.

Benefits & Services

There are numerous services and benefits that will enable an individual to reside in their community setting including educational, rehabilitative or therapy. A Case Manager will guide the individual and family through the process of selecting the necessary services to increase independence. Some examples are listed below:

- o Become integrated in the community where he/she lives and works
- o Develop social relationships in the individual's home and work communities
- o Develop skills to make decisions about how and where the individual wants to live
- o Be as independent as possible

Eligibility

- o ICF/IDD Level of Care
 - o Based on an evaluation when you first apply and annually
 - o The minimum needs a person must have to be considered eligible for the waiver.
- o Eligible for intellectual disability services;
- o Diagnosed as having an intellectual disability, developmental and/or autism

FAMILY SUPPORT WAIVER (FSW)

This waiver provides eligible individuals with access to meaningful, person-centered, community-based services and supports that are important to them. Furthermore, it is provided in a manner that respects the individual's personal beliefs and customs. Eligible individuals will be provided an Individual Support Team (IST) which will include the individual, a Case Manager, and other support professionals selected by the individual and their family. The IST will guide the individual and their families when selecting appropriate, cost-effective services and supports that will help establish the development of social relationships in the home and work community and facilitate independent living.

COMMUNITY INTEGRATION AND HABILITATION WAIVER (CHI)

The Community Integration and Habilitation Waiver (CHI) was formerly known as the Developmental Disabilities Waiver and Autism Waiver. The CIH waiver is designed to provide services and supports to eligible individuals on a priority basis. Some examples include loss of primary caregiver, caregivers over the age of 80, evidence of abuse and/or neglect; other extraordinary health and safety risks.

Assistive Technology, Training and Information Center, Inc.

Hoosier Healthwise - is a health insurance program for Indiana children, pregnant women, and low-income families. Health care is provided at little or no cost to Indiana families enrolled in the program.

Indiana APSE: The Network on Employment - The Network on Employment is a membership organization formed in 1988 as the Indiana Association for Persons in Supported Employment to improve and expand integrated employment opportunities, services, and outcomes for persons experiencing disabilities. Inc. - INARF is a statewide membership organization which provides leadership and support to its constituency in the development of resources and promotion of quality services to increase our members' ability to effectively serve the comprehensive needs of people with disabilities. Over 75 companies (both for profit and not for profit) make up the INARF membership and they provide a variety of services to persons with disabilities.

Indiana Disability Rights - (formerly Indiana Protection & Advocacy Services-IPAS) Indiana Disability Rights protects and advocates for the rights of people with disabilities and is Indiana's federally designated Protection and Advocacy (P&A) system and client assistance program. It is an independent state agency, which receives no state funding and is independent of all service providers, as required by federal and state law.

Indiana Governor's Council for People with Disabilities - is an independent state agency that facilitates change. Their mission is to advance the Independence, productivity, and inclusion of people with disabilities in all aspects of society. This mission is accomplished through planning, evaluation, collaboration, education, research, and advocacy.

The Indiana Institute on Disability and Community (IIDC) - foster communities that welcome, value and support the participation and contributions of people of all ages and abilities through research, education, and service.

Indiana Pop - our mission is to increase access to disability services by making them easier to find. Our directory provides links and contact information for healthcare, advocacy, accessibility, and other disability-related resources and services across the state. The website also provides information on services for seniors and veterans. Use Indiana Pop to look up email addresses, telephone numbers, maps, and more.

Supplemental Security Income (SSI) - provides federal financial assistance, in the form of a monthly check, for eligible individuals who have a disability and who have little income or assets. Children with

disabilities may be eligible for SSI, depending on their level of disability and family income. Eligibility is determined through your local Social Security office.

Children's Special Health Care Services (CSHCS) - is a program to help Indiana children ages birth to 21 years old with severe chronic medical conditions. It helps pay for treatment related to the child's condition. Autism is also a condition that may qualify a child for services from CSHCS. Families who apply for CSHCS must also apply for Medicaid; however, they do not need to be eligible for Medicaid to be eligible for CSHCS. A family with an income before taxes no greater than 250% of the federal poverty level may be eligible for the program. Call: 800- 475-1355.

The Healthy Indiana Plan (HIP) - covers adults age 19-64 whose incomes are less than approximately 138% of the federal poverty level and who are not eligible for Medicare or another Indiana Medicaid category. HIP requires you to make a minimal monthly contribution to your coverage based on the amount of your income.

Medicaid - provides health insurance to eligible low-income individuals. There are several programs available under Medicaid in Indiana. Each program has different eligibility criteria. Unless otherwise noted, eligibility determination is made by the Division of Family Resources (DFR).

Home and Community-Based Services / Medicaid Waiver - Home and Community-Based Services, funded primarily through Indiana's Medicaid Waiver program, provide

supports to families to care for a loved one at home, and supports to adults to live in their own home or small residential program. Because there are waiting lists for Home and Community-Based Services funded by the Medicaid Waiver, it is important to apply and get on a waiting list, even if you do not need services right now.

Residential Services - Residential services are provided in a variety of settings, from residential programs funded through a Medicaid Waiver, to Medicaid funded group homes, to large congregate facilities - including nursing homes and large Intermediate Care Facilities for the Developmentally Disabled (ICFs/DD). Indiana can be proud that all state institutions for people with developmental disabilities have closed, and former residents have transitioned successfully to small, community-based programs. The Arc of Indiana led this effort.

Medicaid Waivers - allow Medicaid to pay for services that support families in caring for a loved one at home, allow adults with disabilities to live in the community with up to 24 hour supports, and supports to help people move out of nursing homes or ICFs/DD. Family income and resources are not counted when determining Medicaid eligibility for children receiving Medicaid waiver services. Because there is a waiting list to get Medicaid Waiver services, it is important to apply and get on the waiting list, even if you do not need services currently. Contact your local Bureau of Developmental Disability Services office to apply.

Group homes - funded by Medicaid, typically serve six to eight people. Contact your local Bureau of Developmental Disability Services office to apply.

Large Intermediate Care Facilities (ICFs-ID/DD) - are funded by Medicaid and are licensed specifically to care for adults with intellectual and other developmental disabilities. Contact your local Bureau of Developmental Disability Services office to apply.

American Association on Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities – Offers a broad range of information regarding disability, including online journals, governmental policy information and online seminars.

Brain Injury Association of Indiana – Dedicated to creating a better future by reducing the incidence and effects of brain injury through public and professional education, advocacy and support, and by facilitating inter-agency commitment and collaboration.

Center for Youth and Adults with Conditions of Childhood – Provides consultative services for youth and young adult patients 11-22 as well as adult patients with developmental disabilities and serious chronic illness.

Disability Legal Services Indiana – Provides free and low-cost legal services to children and adults with disabilities in Indiana.

Governor's Council for People with Disabilities – The Governor's Council for People with Disabilities aims to promote public policy that leads to the independence productivity

and inclusion of people with disabilities in all aspects of society. For people interested in learning how to be an advocate, the council offers a Partners in Policymaking course once a year. The council may also provide financial assistance for people with disabilities who wish to participate in conferences or workshops.

Indiana Disability Rights – Created in 1977 by state law to protect and advocate the rights of people with disabilities. Staff includes disability rights advocates and attorneys who have the authority to pursue appropriate legal and administrative remedies on behalf of people with disabilities, to ensure the enforcement of their rights.

National Conference of Executives of The Arc (NCE) – NCE is a dynamic peer membership organization of chapter Executive Directors and other program and administrative staff. NCE creates opportunities for the exchange of ideas, provides the training that is essential in professional development, and offers support and mentoring for successful leadership.

NICHCY – National Dissemination Center for Children with Disabilities – National resource center providing

Self-Advocates of Indiana – Statewide organization run by and for people with developmental disabilities. SAI helps people to learn, to speak for themselves, and to serve their communities.

Special Olympics Indiana – Provides year-round sports

The Special Needs Alliance (SNA) is a national, not for profit organization of attorneys dedicated to the practice of disability and public benefits law. Individuals with disabilities, their families and their advisors rely on the SNA to connect them with nearby attorneys who focus their practices in the disability law arena. The SNA is

an invitation-only organization. SNA membership is based on a combination of relevant legal experience in the disability and elder law fields, direct family experience with disability, active participation with national, state and local disability advocacy organizations, and professional reputation. As a result, an SNA member will have an average of 18 years of relevant legal experience, with no member having practiced law for less than 5 years. The majority have been certified as Elder Law Attorneys (CELAs) by the National Elder Law Foundation, the certifying entity for the National Academy of Elder Law Attorneys (NAELA).

Family Voices - What they offer: Family-centered care, partnerships, quality, access, affordability and acceptability, health systems that work for families and children, informed families/strong communities and self-advocacy/empowerment. Family Voices aims to achieve family-centered care for all children and youth with special health care needs and/or disabilities. Throughout our national grassroots network, we provide families resources and support to make informed decisions, advocate for improved public and private policies, build partnerships among families and professionals, and serve as a trusted resource on health care.

The ICAM system is owned, maintained, and provided to all Indiana schools by the Office of the Associate Superintendent, the Indiana Department of Education. Access to the system, technical support, and professional training are provided through the ICAM and PATINS projects without a fee.

The Indiana Secondary Transition Resource Center (INSTRC) - creates and enhances professional development activities and resources to improve school and post-school outcomes for students with disabilities. Driven by current transition research and effective practices, the center partners with schools, families, students, and community organizations to build statewide and local capacity for improving post-school outcomes.

Noble of Indiana - has created opportunities for people with developmental disabilities, like Down Syndrome and autism, to live meaningful lives. Noble of Indiana offers early intervention therapies for

babies and toddlers, summer camps and transition services for students, employment and life skills training for adults, and mentoring and respite for families.

The PATINS - (Promoting Achievement Through Technology and Instruction for All Students) Project is an Indiana Department of Education/Division of Student Learning/Office of Differentiated Learners assistive technology systems change initiative. The project is designed to impact both the organizational capacities of local public schools and the professional capabilities of school staff in the delivery of assistive technology services and the implementation of Universal Design for Learning Principles. Cerebral Palsy

Cure CP - This organization was founded by two families that were directly affected by cerebral palsy. Motivated by the desire to build a better life for their children, these parents created Cure CP to help fund and support research for cerebral palsy. Currently, there is no cure for cerebral palsy, and this can be frustrating for anyone affected by this disorder. Cure CP specifically supports research geared toward developing a cure and providing hope for the future.

Cerebral Palsy Foundation - was founded in the 1950s. This organization contributes millions of dollars each year to cerebral palsy research. These studies and clinical trials focus on finding new treatments that increase mobility and improve the overall quality of life for people with CP. In addition to funding research, the Cerebral Palsy Foundation also campaigns to increase the level of federal support for people with CP. They are leaders in advocating for better educational programs for doctors, nurses and therapists.

Reaching for The Stars - This advocacy group primarily strives to increase federal funding for cerebral palsy research. They focus on improving treatment methods used in children with CP and they work endlessly towards finding a cure for this condition. Reaching for The Stars also founded the "CP Kids Coalition." This is a group of young people who produce articles and engage in discussions about the issues surrounding transitioning into adulthood with cerebral palsy. This is also a great place for young adults with cerebral palsy to meet other people they can relate to.

The American Academy of Cerebral Palsy and Developmental Medicine - is dedicated to improvement in the care of people with childhood-onset disability, their families, and communities. Their website offers various resources for individuals and families, including a directory of providers.

First Steps

Mission

To ensure that all Indiana families with infants and toddlers experiencing developmental delays or disabilities have access to early intervention services.

Vision

All infants and toddlers have the right to live, play, learn, and participate in their community.

Values

Indiana first steps seek to provide services that are:

- Family centered
- Strengths-based
- Relationship-based
- Holistic
- Culturally competent
- Routines-based
- Individualized

Eligibility

Families with children ages birth to third birthday who are experiencing developmental delays and/or have a diagnosed condition that has a high probability of resulting in developmental delay may be eligible for first steps services.

Services Offered

The goal of First Steps is to help Hoosier families make sure their infants and toddlers receive services now to help them in the future. Services through First Steps are designed to meet the developmental needs of the child, except in limited circumstances. First Steps does not provide services to meet medical needs.

Services available through First Steps include:

Assistive Technology (AT) devices include a variety of items, equipment, materials or services, used with individual children to increase, maintain or improve their functional capabilities. May also include adaptations to toys and learning materials that permit the child to be more successful in their play and developmental activities; evaluation and adaptation of currently used equipment; or evaluation and adaptation of the child's environment.


Audiological services, including signed and cued language services, can identify if the child has a hearing loss, how significant the loss is and what it means to the child's ability to communicate and develop. May include training in specific ways of communication, fitting with and maintenance of hearing aids and ensuring that the family can operate and care for the hearing aids.

Developmental Therapy (DT): see **Special Instruction** below.

Family education, training, counseling and home visits are provided to assist the family in understanding the special needs of the child and enhancing the child's development. Early intervention providers credentialed at the specialist level may provide these services.

Health services refer to medical care provided during the time a child is receiving other early intervention services, so that the child will benefit from the other early intervention services. These may include intermittent catheterization or tracheotomy care. It may also include helping the child's physician work with other early intervention providers concerning the special health needs of the child.

Medical services for diagnostic purposes are only for diagnostic/evaluation purposes to determine a child's developmental status and need for early intervention services, when eligibility cannot otherwise be determined.



Nursing services are individual interventions conducted with the child and/or family that support the other early intervention services. They may include assessment of health status, provision of care to prevent health problems, restore or improve functioning, and promote optimal health and development.

Nutrition services focus on specific nutritional needs, including assessment and development of a nutrition plan that is individualized and referral to appropriate community resources.

Occupational Therapy (OT) develops adaptive and self-help skills with focus on developing skills related to sensory-motor integration, coordination of movement, fine motor skills, self-help skills (including feeding), and may include adaptive devices or equipment to help the child in these activities.

Physical Therapy (PT) focuses on gross motor skills and the ability to move and effectively use his/her arms, legs, trunk and head.

Psychological services are concerned with the child's learning and social/emotional development. Included is administration of psychological/developmental assessments, planning and managing a program of psychological services that may include counseling the child and family and providing parent training and education programs specific to the child's developmental needs.

Service Coordination (SC) ensures that the family is well informed of their rights, opportunities and responsibilities within the program. They assist the family in assuming an advocacy role for their child and they assist the family to develop, monitor and revise

the Individual Family Service Plan (IFSP) to include appropriate outcomes and services that are family centered and supportive of the family's lifestyle and schedule. Service Coordinators work with the family to identify and plan for transitions within and out of First Steps.

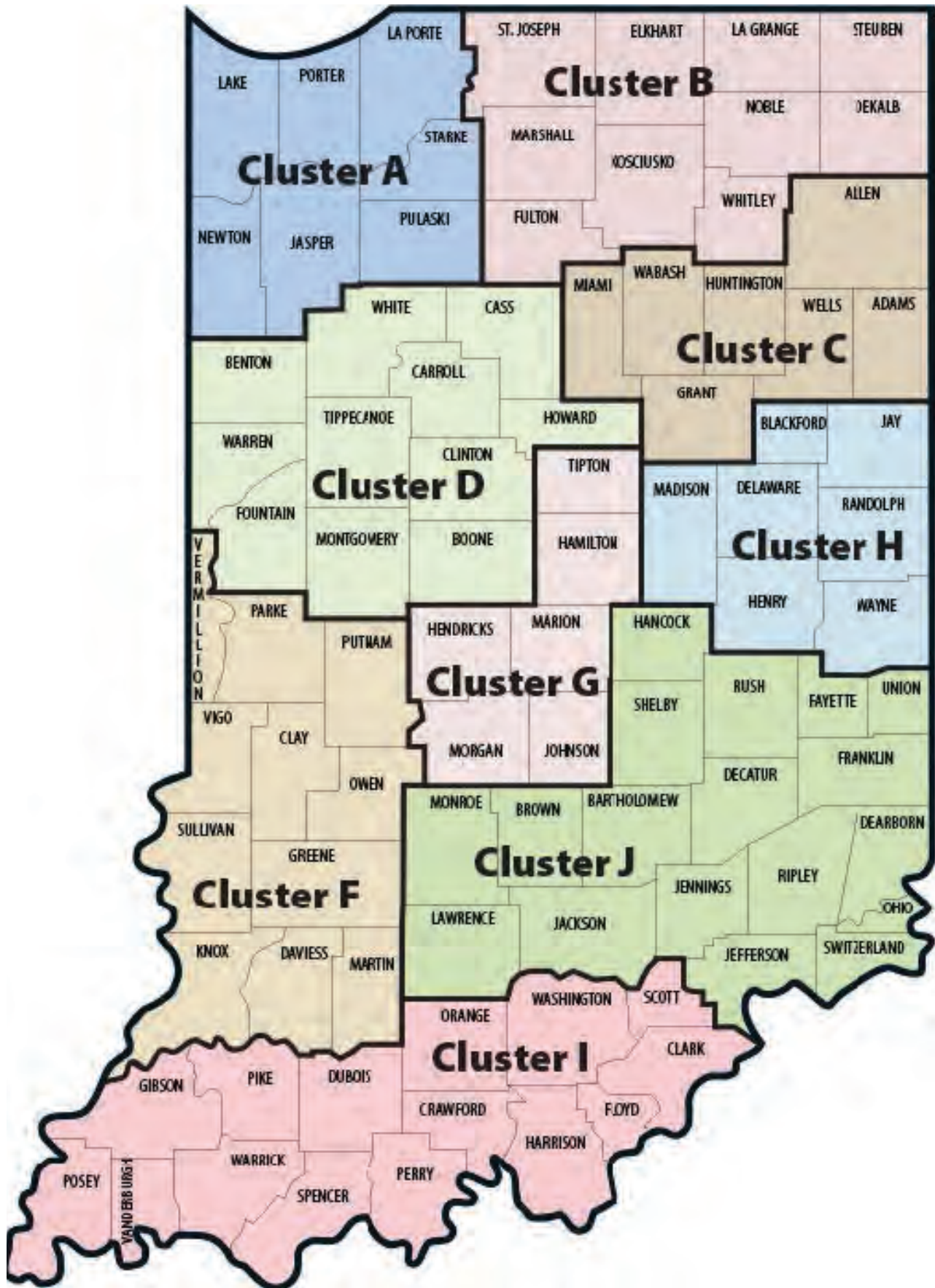
Social Work services support the family by assisting them to resolve difficulties or concerns that interfere with or prevent the child from participating fully in early intervention services. Service may include family counseling and linking the family with resources or other services in their community.

Special Instruction [Developmental Therapy (DT)] focuses on infant/toddler development and ways to promote development. This includes designing learning environments and activities to promote development across all domains: cognitive; physical; communication; social/emotional; and adaptive.

Speech Therapy focuses on receptive (understanding what is said) and expressive (being able to speak so that others can understand) communication. It may include the use of sign language, augmentative communication devices or other assistive technology. SLP may also be involved with the child's feeding program.

Transportation and related costs include travel costs that families must bear so that their child can participate in early intervention evaluation and/or services.

Vision services include evaluation and assessment of the child's ability to see and orientation/mobility services to enhance the vision-impaired child's ability to move about safely.

ABA Therapy - Applied Behavior Analysis

Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) is a therapy based on the science of learning and behavior.

Behavior analysis helps us to understand how behavior works, how behavior is affected by the environment and how learning takes place.

ABA therapy applies our understanding of how behavior works to real situations. The goal is to increase behaviors that are helpful as well as socially acceptable and decrease behaviors that are harmful or affect learning.

ABA therapy programs can help increase language and communication skills. ABA therapy can improve attention, focus, social skills, memory, and academics and decrease maladaptive behaviors.
